“I love the Christmas season,” said Dennis, “and I’m a Jew.”

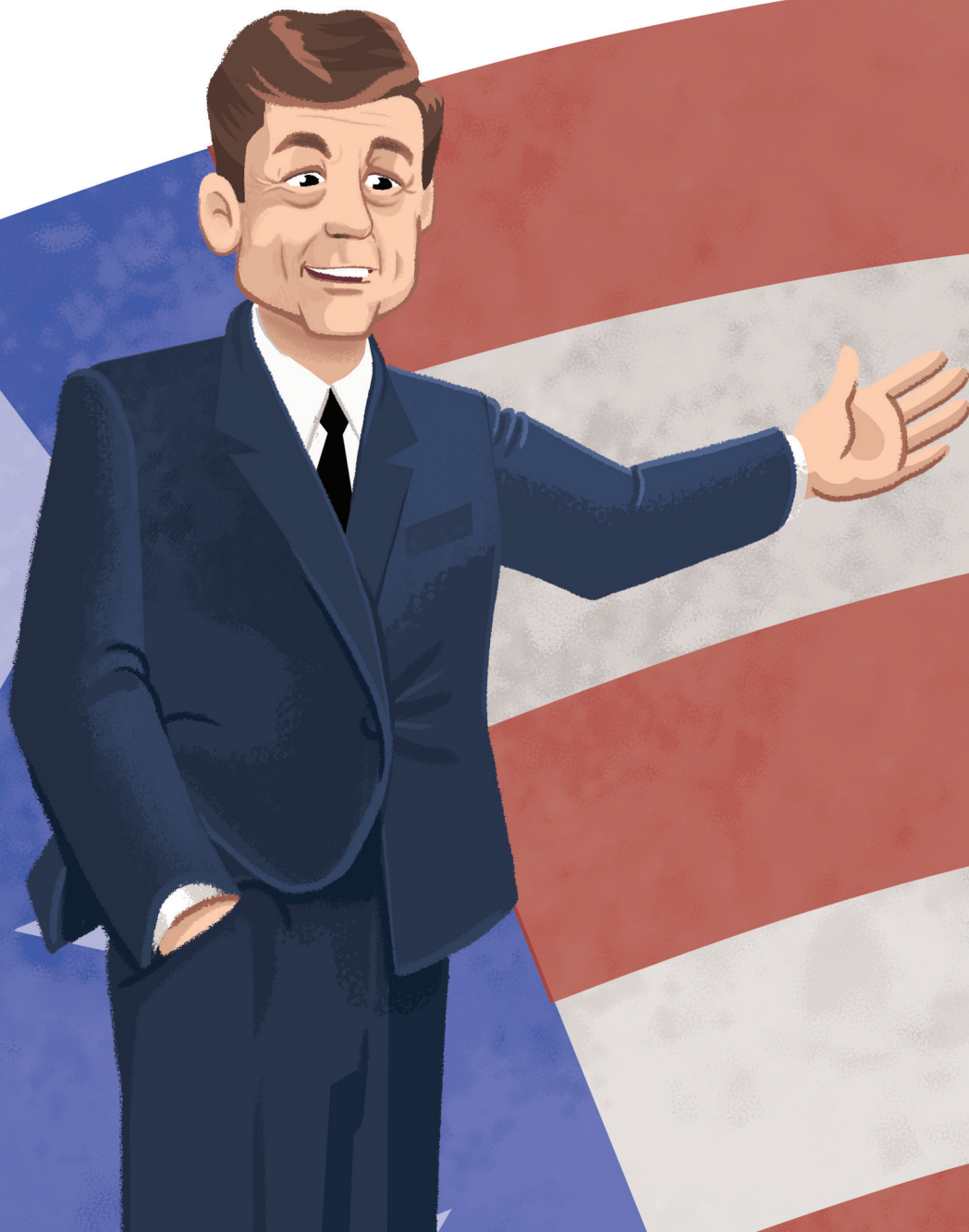
“Really?” I asked. “So, the phrase ‘Merry Christmas’ doesn’t exclude you?”

“That’s right, Otto. Giving to others brings out the Christmas spirit in everyone.”

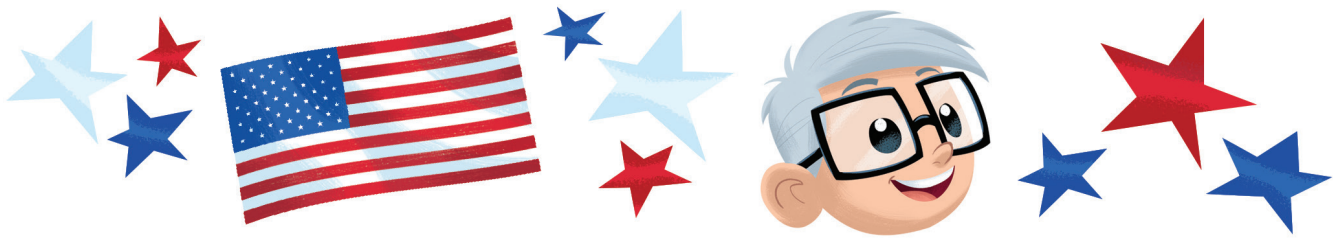
“I love the Christmas spirit!” I barked.

# We Love Our History

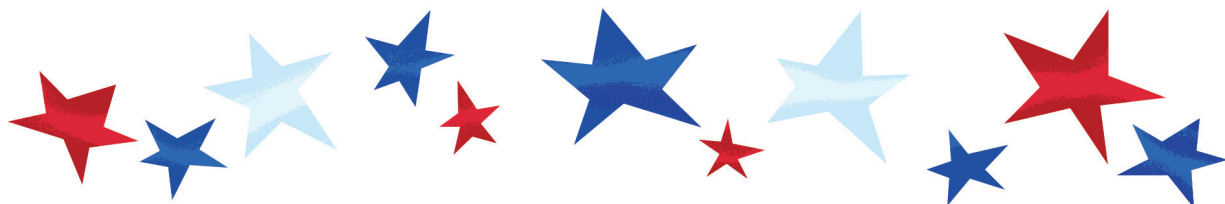
**Christmas:** The day Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus. On this day, people enjoy traditions, sing carols, and exchange gifts with their families and friends.

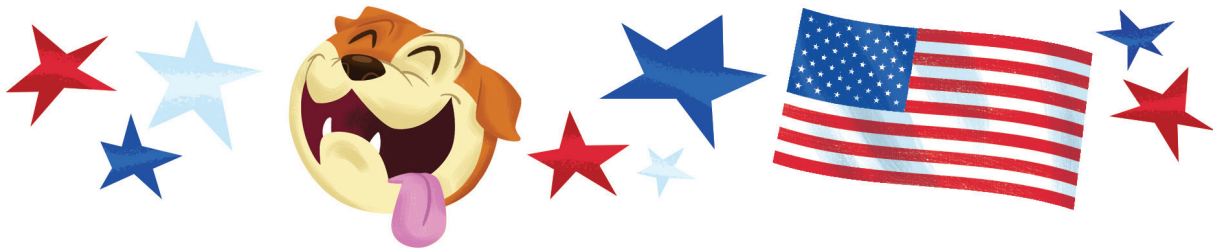
**Holy Land:** The area in the Middle East where many important events in Jewish, Christian, and Muslim history occurred. Jesus, a Jew, lived his entire life in the area.

**Three Wise Men:** Three individuals, sometimes called “the Magi,” who Christians believe traveled very far to worship Jesus when he was born. Some believe their names were Melchior, Gaspar, and Balthazar.

**Gold, Frankincense, and Myrrh:** The gifts that the three wise men gave to Jesus. Gold is a precious metal that is used to make jewelry and money. Frankincense and myrrh are substances from trees that release a pleasing scent when burned as incense. They are often used in religious ceremonies.

**Jesus:** A religious leader from the Holy Land in the first century who Christians regard as the Son of God and Savior of all who believe in Him. Although He was, at first, a carpenter from Nazareth, He began preaching about God’s kingdom. According to Christian belief, He was crucified for the sins of humanity, and, three days later, rose from the dead, thereby conquering death.



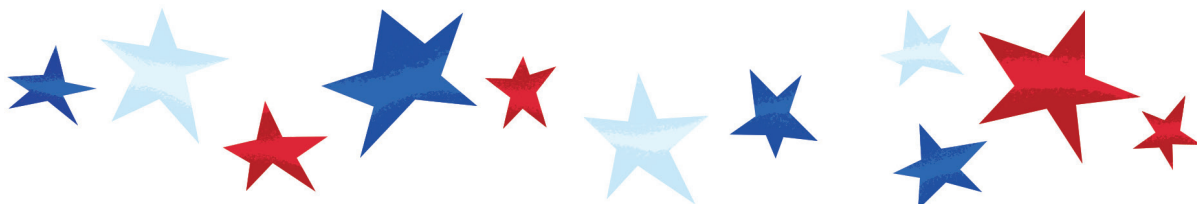


**Saint Nicholas:** A Christian bishop from Greece who lived in modern-day Turkey from 270 AD-343 AD. Legend has it that he would anonymously throw bags of gold coins into the windows of the poor. The coins supposedly landed in the shoes or stockings that were drying by the fireplace, giving rise to the Christmas tradition of the “stocking stuffer.” After Nicholas died and was declared a saint, his popularity and positive Christmas message spread across Europe. Some believe he is Santa Claus.

**John F. Kennedy:** The 35th President of the United States, from 1961-1963. He was the youngest man ever elected president and was very popular.

**Jackie:** Jaqueline Kennedy was the wife of John F. Kennedy and First Lady of the United States. She began the tradition of selecting a theme for the official White House Christmas tree in the Blue Room in 1961.

**Irving Berlin:** A Jewish American composer and songwriter who wrote many famous songs for musicals and movies during the early ragtime and jazz periods. Two of his most famous songs are “White Christmas” and “God Bless America.”

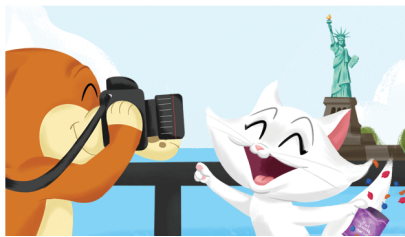

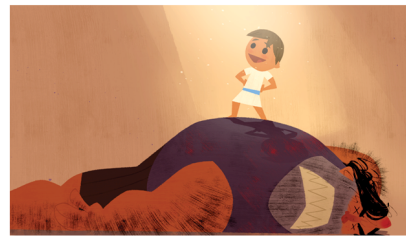
