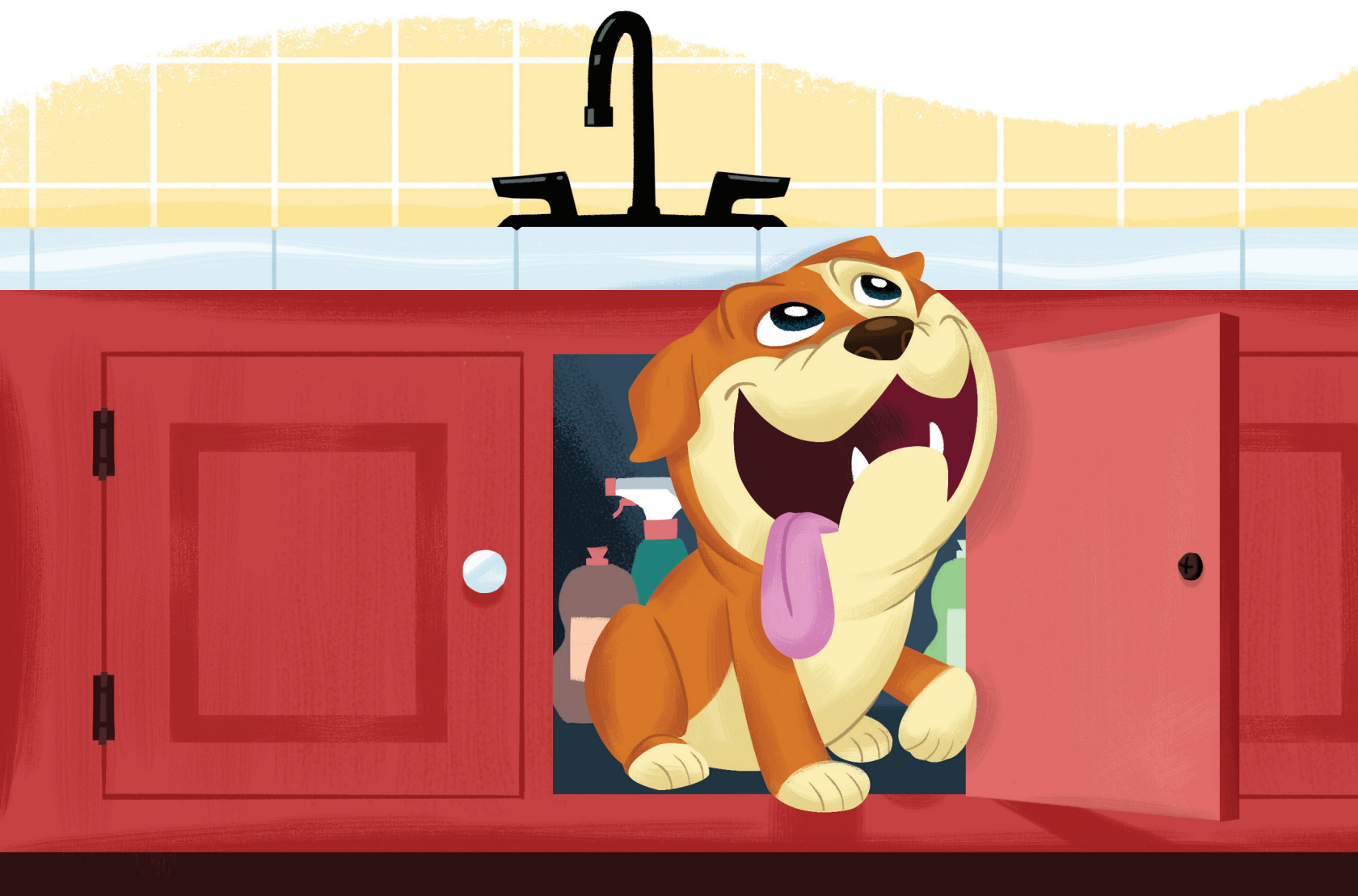


Ruff Ruff!

They displayed great courage, a trait exceedingly rare.



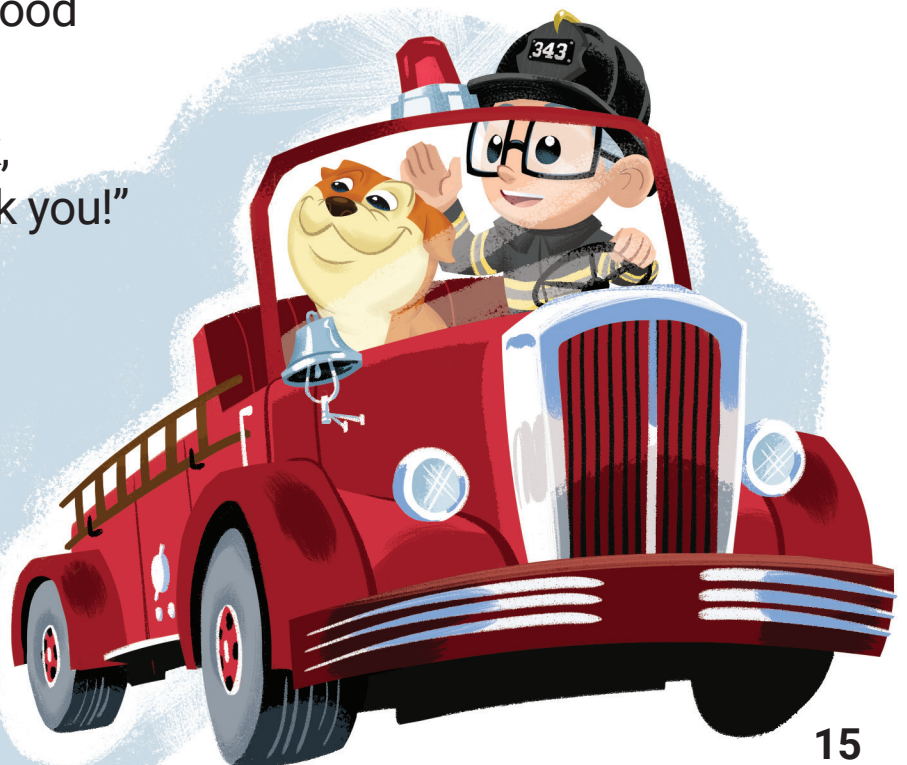
There were people helping each other all over the place.

But our country is strong—America they can’t defeat.”

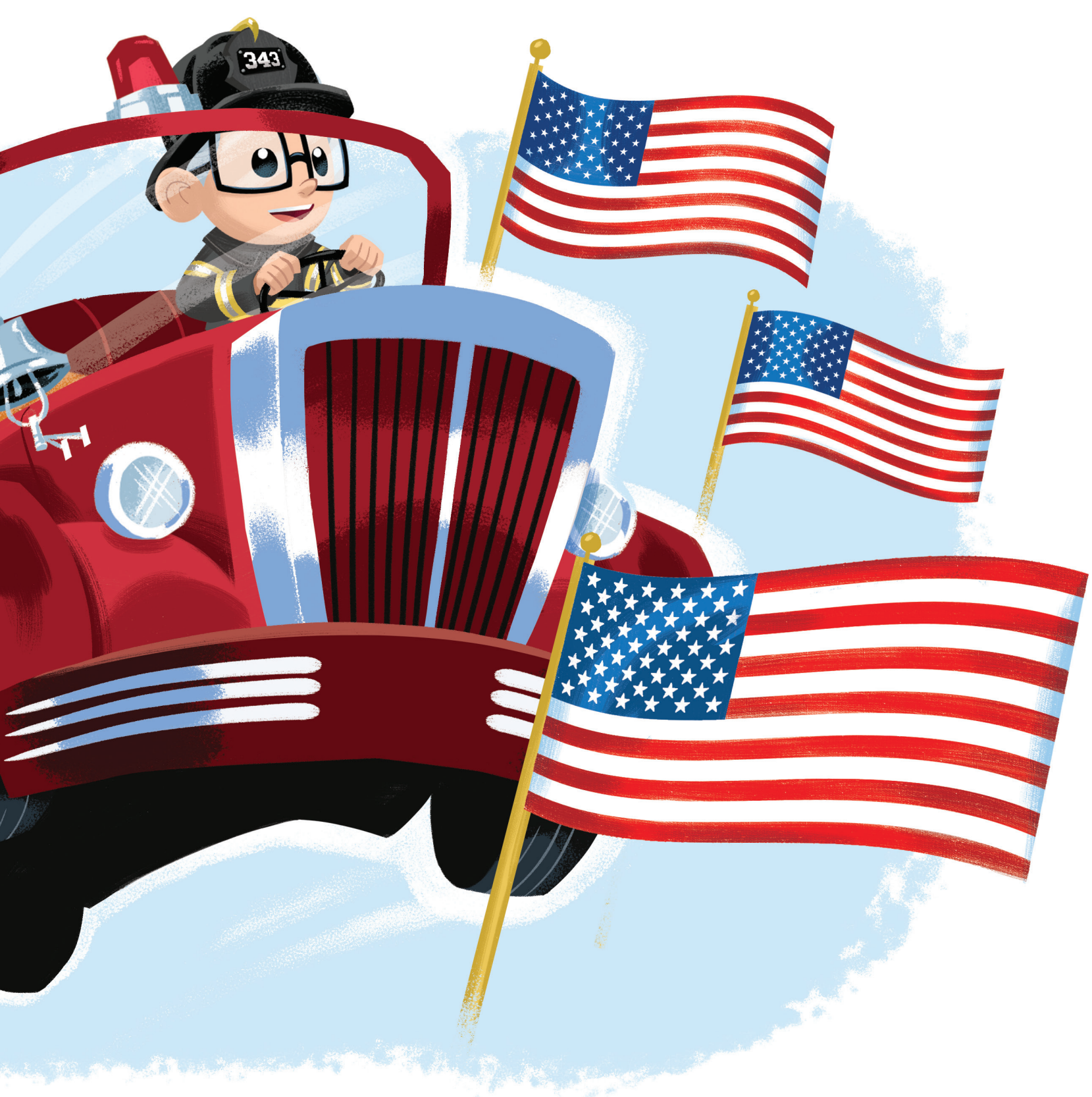


Dennis chimed in, “We saw so many people today doing good. Americans helping each other in any way they could.”

We returned to New York on another 11th of September.

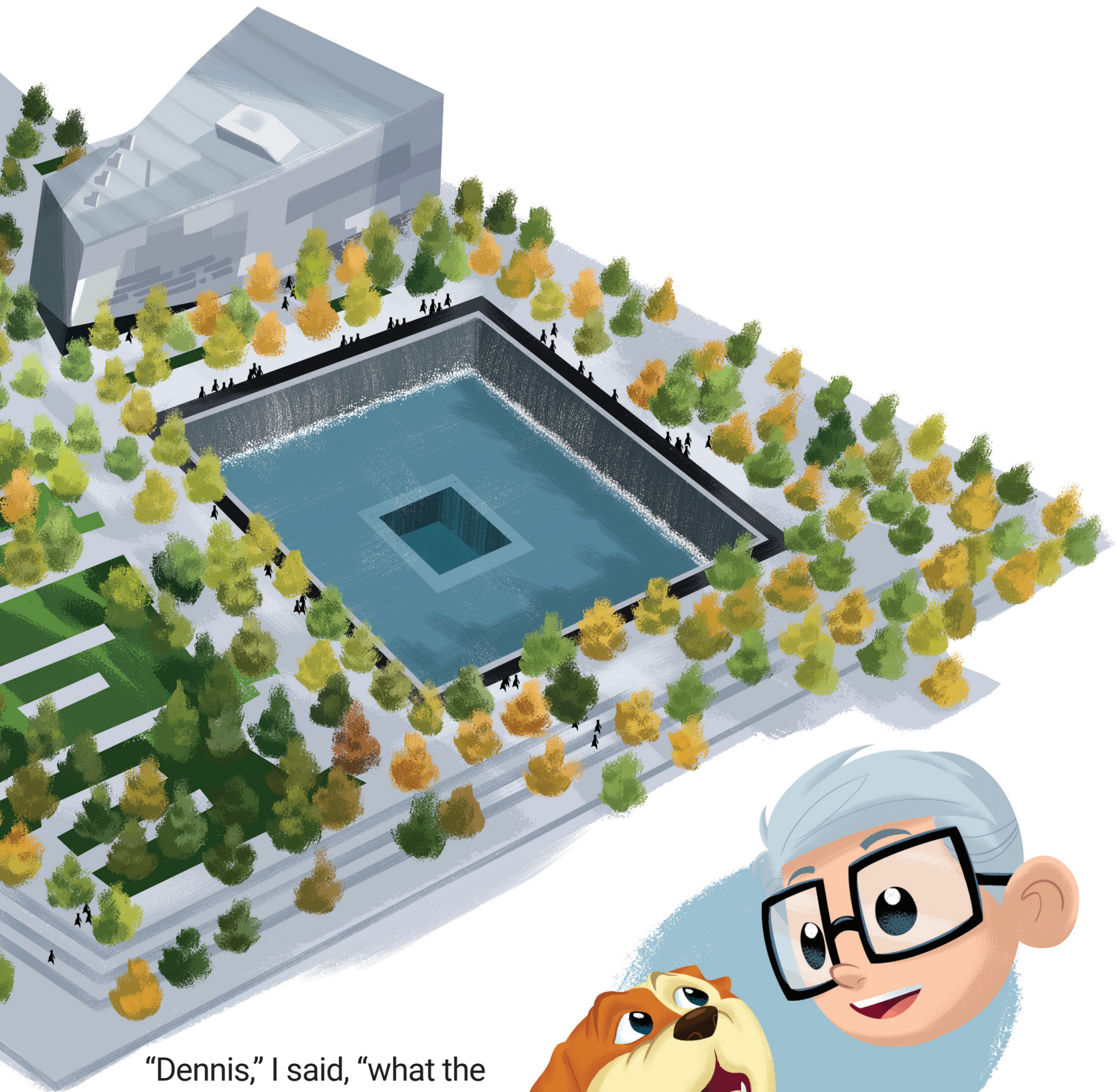
The city built the **9/11 Memorial** to help us remember.

“And Americans came together even stronger after that terrible attack,” I said.

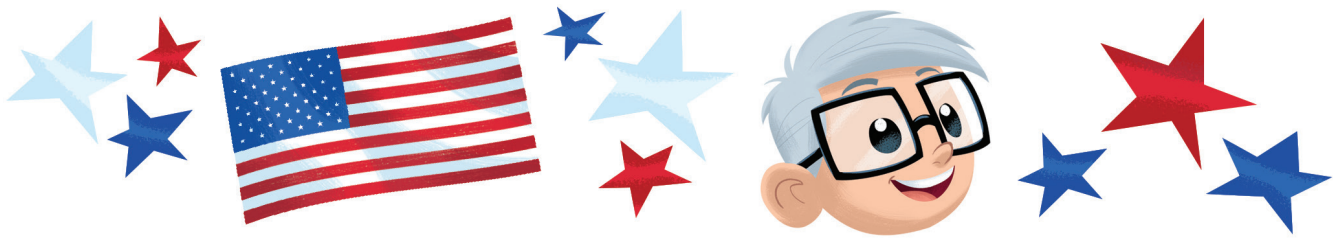

We Love Our History

September 11th: The day terrorists attacked America in 2001. They hijacked four planes, crashed two of them into the World Trade Center in New York City, one into the Pentagon outside of our capital, Washington, D.C., and one into a field in Pennsylvania, after the passengers attempted to take the plane back from the terrorists.

New York City: America's biggest city, and the site of the World Trade Center that was attacked by terrorists on September 11, 2001.

World Trade Center: A complex of several big office buildings in New York City. Many of them were destroyed or damaged on September 11, 2001. Some of them have been rebuilt since that tragic day.

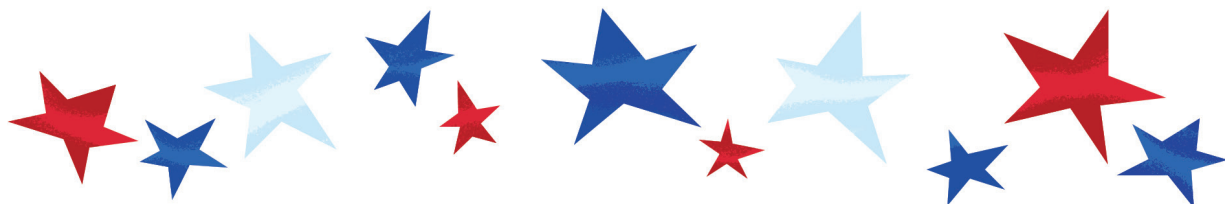
Twin Towers: The two tallest and most famous buildings of the World Trade Center before they were struck by hijacked planes and collapsed on September 11, 2001. They were called the "Twin Towers" because there were two of them placed close together, soaring 110 stories into the Manhattan skyline, and they looked almost identical.

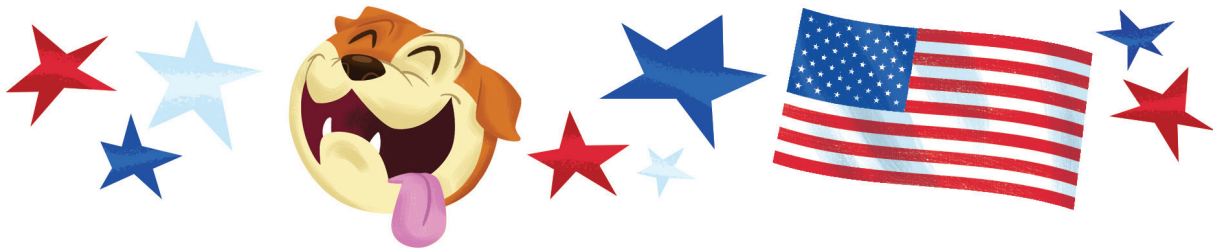
Terrorists: People who use the fear and intimidation of violence to get their way.

Osama bin Laden: The founder and leader of the Al-Qaeda terrorist group. He wanted to destroy America and the American way of life.

Al-Qaeda: A terrorist group founded by Osama bin Laden. The group planned and executed the September 11 attacks. They had previously attacked American soldiers, including the bombing of the Navy ship *USS Cole* in 2000 in the country of Yemen.

George W. Bush: The 43rd President of the United States, from 2001-2009. President Bush helped lead and unite Americans after the September 11 attacks.





9/11 Memorial: The memorial in New York City to the victims of the September 11 attacks. In the place where the Twin Towers once stood are the footprints of the towers: two giant holes in the ground with beautiful waterfalls flowing down all four walls, and the name of every victim inscribed in bronze plaques along the edge of the waterfalls.

Ground Zero: The name adopted immediately after the attacks for the location where the Twin Towers once stood.

Pentagon: The headquarters of our nation's military, located close to Washington, D.C., our nation's capital. It was also attacked with a hijacked plane on September 11.

Flight 93: One of the planes that was hijacked by terrorists on September 11. The brave passengers realized what was happening, and attempted to take the plane back from the terrorists. They didn't succeed, but they prevented the plane from hitting another target (probably the Capitol building), and probably saved many lives that would have been lost had the plane reached its intended target. They are among that terrible day's many heroes.

Patriot Day: The national holiday that takes place every year on September 11 in memory of the victims of the September 11 attack and the first responders who saved so many lives that day.

Tribute in Light: A tribute that takes place every year on the night of September 11. Vertical searchlights are arranged in two columns of light beaming upward into the sky near where the Twin Towers used to stand in Lower Manhattan. It is a moving and haunting reminder to everyone of the awe-inspiring Twin Towers that once stood there and the tragedy of the lives lost that day.

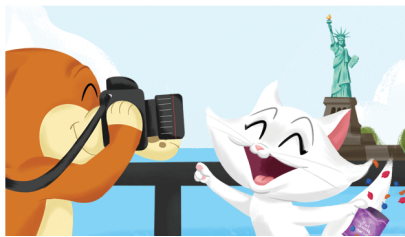

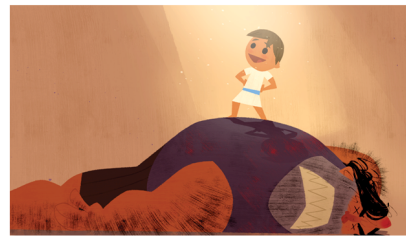
