Sample answer: Susan B. Anthony considered it her life's mission to get women the right to vote. She believed that right was outlined in the U.S. Constitution.
- What "radical" thing did Susan B. Anthony do to let the people know she was serious about the cause of voting equality for women? How did that turn out?

Susan B. Anthony went to a polling place and voted for President Ulysses S. Grant, even though voting was illegal for women at that time. She was arrested and fined \$100, but she did not pay the fine because she believed it was NOT wrong for a citizen to vote.
