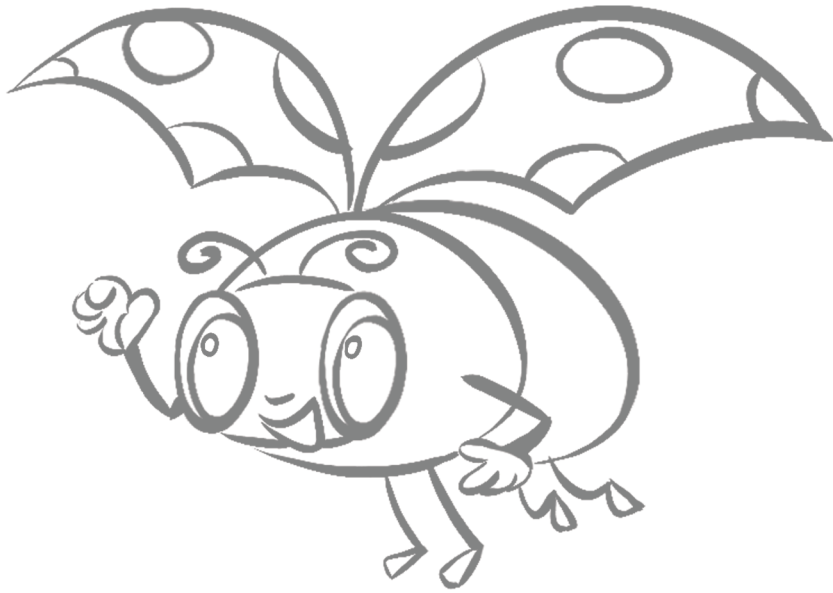

1. Stack



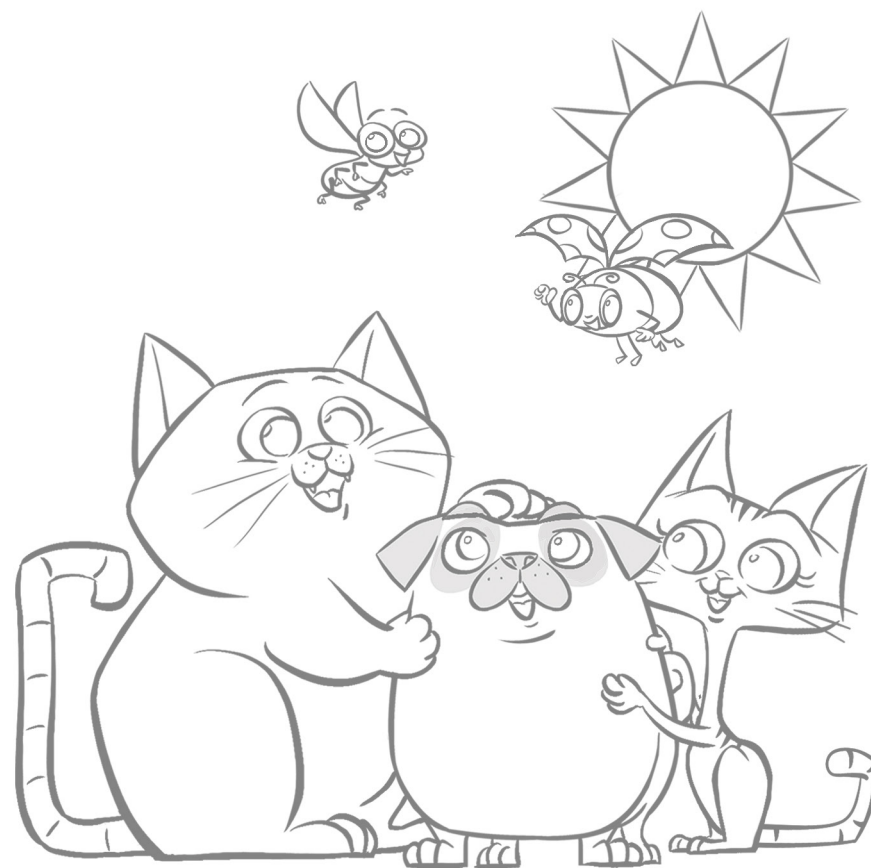
2. Staple
